Thank you for considering the Generation Joshua Leadership Academy! We are excited to welcome a number of students into this growing initiative. This program will last from September until mid-August. The Leadership Academy is a gap year program for students taking a break from academics to gain practical political and ministry experience. This is not a typical internship, nor is it a typical educational program. It is designed to help participants grow as whole people, combining academic study, spiritual enrichment, practical work experience, and intentional mentorship. You will be surrounded by a seasoned team of individuals who are passionate about their faith and the mission of Generation Joshua who come alongside you as you stretch and grow personally, professionally, and spiritually in a vibrant ministry environment. This program is a one-of-a-kind experience that will impact your life as God grows you in ways you could never predict.

As a Leadership Academy student, you will become acquainted with the fast-paced office environment of Generation Joshua and that of HSLDA, where GenJ's national headquarters is located. You will be expected to work approximately 30 hours a week and keep up with assigned studies including: weekly class sessions, reading assignments, and writing projects. This program is not paid but provides a rent stipend for housing, a lunch meal plan in the Patrick Henry College cafeteria, and a stipend to help offset some related living expenses such as meals, daily essentials, living supplies, and books.

Participants will be trained to serve on the leadership team for GenJ's key programs (including Student Action Teams, our intensive simulations, and our summer camps). This is a time-intensive program, often requiring long workdays, commitment, passion, and a willingness to work hard. Serving with Generation Joshua is one of the most rewarding experiences of its caliber and will give you many unique opportunities to grow as a leader.

Ideal applicants will demonstrate the following attributes: a passion to learn, a heart for ministry, a strong work ethic, leadership capabilities, organizational skills, creativity, strong communication skills, and a willingness to engage in the American civic process. All these attributes must be carried out in accordance with the principles laid out in the Generation Joshua Statement of Faith and the Generation Joshua Core Values. This program seeks applicants who are 18-25 years of age (at the start of the program), high school graduates, with legal status in the United States.

We are specifically looking for Leadership Academy Students with skills/interest in the following areas:

Graphic design, creative writing, strong communication skills, editing experience, experience with Sitefinity CMS, research, video production, data research and analysis, and photography.

Vacation: We ask that Leadership Academy students not take personal breaks during the internship. We will follow a pre-approved schedule modeled after an academic calendar and while we will approve some class skips, it is difficult to catch up with the crowded schedule.

Time commitment: This is a year-long intensive program with a high demand on your time and focus. Due to extensive time commitments during the program, it is recommended that Leadership Academy Students be discerning regarding outside employment, studies, and other commitments.

Personal appearance: Leadership Academy students are expected to uphold a clean, modest, and non-distracting

appearance in their dress for all meetings, classes, programs, etc. In the office environment of the HSLDA National Headquarters, interns are expected to follow the office policy for attire.

Health insurance: Leadership Academy students should provide for their own health expenses. Neither HSLDA, Generation Joshua, nor the Leadership Academy is responsible for covering hospitalization, visits to the doctor, or medications.

Vehicle: Leadership Academy students are responsible for their own transportation and timeliness (i.e., they must be

punctual for meetings and classes) whether they have a vehicle or not.

Personal expenditures: Leadership Academy students are required to have sufficient funds to cover all personal and living expenses incurred throughout the internship.
